Ashmont Street offers approximately 54 one- and two- bedroom apartments in a unique two-story, garden-style setting built in the 1960s. Our sunny apartments and quiet community provide residents with a nice place to call home.

We offer many amenities for elderly and disabled individuals, which include emergency pull cords in the bedrooms and bathrooms as well as intercoms in every apartment. We have units that are handicap accessible and we may modify existing apartments based on Reasonable Accommodation requests.

Residents pay 30 percent of their income towards rent, prorated rent, or a predetermined flat rent.

LOCATION

Ashmont Street is conveniently located just outside Peabody Square in Dorchester. A number of stores and businesses are located nearby, including a convenience and lunch shop on Adams Street and a Store 24 in Peabody Square. Health care is available at Carney Hospital.
